Learn to use free online tools and media to bring your students' classroom experience into the 21st century. Technology educators Shelley Owen and Timothy McKean have been using online technologies to enrich their programs from elementary to University levels. Explore tools such as educational online games, rich video and audio content, podcasts, blogs, wikis, social bookmarking, and many more. Participants will meet together for an introductory discussion of Web 2.0 tools then break off into two sessions based on ability and comfort levels. Beginners and advanced users welcome.

■ Digital Storytelling—January 10, 2008

Digital Storytelling is the practice of using computer-based tools to tell stories. Digital stories usually contain a mixture of computer-based images, text, recorded audio narration, video clips and/or music. Topics used in Digital Storytelling range from personal tales to the recounting of historical events to the search for life in other corners of the universe, and literally, everything in between. As a participant, you will create your own digital story, "All About Me". Participants could write a short narrative about themselves to accompany their images. This workshop is for any level learner.
